Java Joes – Janine Wilson contacted Scott at Java Joes and he is looking at our website before he decides to give us a show in 2019.

Caroline LeBlanc is meeting with **Keshet Dance**Company this month regarding a possible exhibition there.

September Flash Mob -KD Neely who has a gallery at 104 4th near Central is coordinating an effort to create art on Tyvek suits. The art should be related to outrageous political statements. Call KD at 485 -9246 to get a suit. A flash mob will happen in September and then the suits will be displayed in her gallery.
