

Treasurer's report: Balance is \$1,859.82.

Don't forget to come to the spirit dolls workshop at Off Center, Saturday, December 8, from 11-2. Bring any material you have for this project.

Keshet exhibition – Caroline LeBlanc and Janine Wilson met with Keshet and they offered us the opportunity to exhibit in their space for all of 2019. The first three months is the theme of Movement. Since is our first exhibition at Keshet, we are keeping images to 16x20 or smaller until we get a feel for the space. Janine Wilson stated that the space looks much better than it did in the photos. Caroline LeBlanc and Janine Wilson will hang the show. The theme for the March – May show will be Spring.

We do not have to attend the performances but Keshet encourages us to be present before and after performances to talk about our art. We will have a small table with our artist statements and business cards. Janine Wilson will email the performance schedule each month.

Rainbow joined KIIC for \$120 and as members, we are eligible for a 25% discount on performances, and up to 5 members can attend each KIIC workshop free. Janine will email Rainbow members when workshops are scheduled.
