**Rainbow Artists Monthly Meeting** Tuesday, July 19, 2 pm **North Fourth Art Center** 4904 Fourth St. NW **Program: Design & Fantasy Florals** 

Roberta Delgado will be talking about a remarkable breakthrough in art education that was developed by Adolfo Best Maguard in Mexico. In the early decades of the 20th century, with the help of highly acclaimed artists as Diego Rivera and Miguel Covarrubias. This method revolutionized art and art education in Mexico eventually exerting a strong influence on art education worldwide. Best Maguard wrote a book called A Method for Creative Design (1926), where untrained artists were able to master the basics of design by combining and arranging any two of the Archetypal Seven Elements: a spiral, circle, half circle, two half circles in the form of the letter S, wavy line, zigzag line and straight line. Through his writing the author probed the inner workings of creative imagination and the forces that affect and control the creative process.

We will experiment with the different elements of design to draw and create fantasy florals. Bring Colored pencils, alcohol inks or any art media. More examples will be available.


