Seeking a mural artist currently residing in New Mexico for two (2) mural panels at Luminaria Senior Community near Eubank and Central in Albuquerque. Luminaria Senior Community is a public-private partnership with the New Mexico State Land Office and City of Albuquerque. Compensation and expenses: GAHP will provide a one-time grant of \$15,000 total to the awarded artist to cover materials, supplies, equipment, labor, transportation, and compensation for the artist's time for the design and installation of the two (2) murals.
