Program: Portrait Sketching with live model

Barbara Endicott will lead us in sketching from a live model. Bring either a sketchbook with a firm backing or a couple sheets of paper taped to a drawing board. The size of the paper can vary according to what scale you are comfortable with. The firm backing is important because we will draw with the drawing surface tilting up, propped up by the edge of the table. A table easel would also work. Drawing flat makes it easy to get proportions out of whack. As far as drawing materials bring either a pencil or charcoal, whichever is preferred, as well as an eraser.



Barbara is known for her ability to capture a likeness by finding the subtle differences that make each of us unique. Each face is a particular configuration of proportion but more importantly is a map of life experience.
