Janine Wilson will continue to coordinate the exhibitions with Tortuga and the Los Lunas Museum.

After discussion, the group voted not to have an exhibition at 606 Gallery in September due to location, cost and short time frame.

Women for Peace-Nobel Prize Winners, Tortuga Gallery October 4-26. Reception October 4, 6-8 pm. Bring finger food. Drop off, Monday, September 30 from 3-5:30 pm. Besides the prize winners, Logan would like to see 3D and 2D art about Peace. We need to fill the gallery so this is a chance for everyone to participate. If you did not choose a prize winner, you can produce art with the theme of peace. Please let Janine know if you are going to participate. Besides the exhibit, we will have a three ring notebook of information about the prize winners. Logan is also making a poster to sell for \$10 with images from the show. If you have a prize winner, please contact Janine Wilson to pick up your 5x7 frame for the blurb that goes next to your painting. Logan would also like to see us do a workshop or presentation during this exhibition. Please contact Janine: janineabq@gmail.com with any ideas for this. Mary Jane Milz suggested making peace flags with children and will talk to Logan about the feasibility of this.

Next year is our 30th anniversary as well as the 100th anniversary of the women's vote. Tortuga is willing to have a show around this theme, possibly in March. So be thinking of art you can create for this. Details will be coming in future newsletters.

Possible future locations for the Women for Peace exhibition: Los Lunas Museum of Art and Heritage (Janine will pursue this one), Peace and Justice Center, Main Library, Edna Ferguson Library, Juan Tabo Library, South Broadway Library, and Los Griegos Library. The Exhibition Committee will pursue these after October.

Caroline LeBlanc and Janine Wilson will meet with Keshet. Since we paid for a year of KIIC membership there, we might as well see if we can make it work better.

Sue Pine approached Daily Grind and we are waiting to hear back.

Restaurants: Grace Collins, Sue Pine, Carol Sullivan, Janine Wilson met with various restaurants in Nob Hill to see if we can hang art there. Two restaurants with the most space were chosen and Carol Sullivan will be putting out a call to entry soon for this. Thanks to Carol for all her hard work on this. There will be no fee for these shows.

Rainbows are all members of KIIC at Keshet. They are giving a workshop on Saturday and Sunday, August 24-25 on the Business of Art. This will cover grant writing, financial management, contracts, and copyright. Call Keshet to sign up at 244-9808 and tell them you are a Rainbow member to attend. Five of us can attend for free.

SHOW DATES: August 26th to September 30th, 2019

DELIVER WORK: (08/26/19)

and SIZE OF ART: (2 pieces no larger than (16x20) and the Coordinator reserves the right to curate entries of more work is received than there is room to hang.

FRAMING: All pieces must be ready for display including frames and appropriate wiring. (No saw tooth hangers please.) Paintings may be left unframed if they are cradleboard or have "gallery wrap."

TAGS: All art must be tagged on the back with the artist name, title, medium, size and sales price. Also, your information on how to be contacted for sale.

PICK UP WORK: All work must be picked up on **09/30/19 between 4-6pm**. Be prompt as there is no place to store your work. If you cannot pick up your art, make arrangement with someone to do it for you.
