Program: Fun and Easy Monotype Prints


Carol Adamec will lead a fun, hands-on demonstration of basic trace monotype techniques that can be done at home with inexpensive and common art materials. These processes have been used by well known artists such as Paul Gauguin, Edgar Degas, Kathe Kallowitz, Henri Matisse, and Jaune Quick-to-See-Smith, among many others. We'll be creating 4"x6" prints, using different approaches with a variety of results.

Please bring the following items:

- writing/marking instruments, such as ball point pens, pencils, a stylus
- small images or drawings you want to work from
- paint brushes (soft/bristle)

If you have any of these items, bring them too:

• inking brayer, glue stick, scissors, collage scraps
