- * A Bachelor's degree, preferably in Non-Profit/ Business Management, Social Services or Art Therapy—with five or more years in organization management and/or supervising staff and volunteers in a related setting and familiarity with non-profit organizations, fundraising and grant writing.
- * Must be able to work independently and manage several projects simultaneously.
