In her “In a Japanese Garden – An Interpretation” solo show at the Weyrich Gallery, Adamec introduces the Kimono Series to chronicle her transition into the realm of abstraction.

Adamec has arrived at a creative junction that is likely to open many more doors than it closes. Her current work is well-crafted, thoughtfully designed and inspired by majestic cultural milestones. Most of the pieces are small, but like medieval monks having large thoughts in small rooms, Adamec has tapped into the power and fragility of the butterfly.

To paraphrase the late and great Muhammed Ali, Adamec’s mixed media and painted works float like butterflies and sting like bees. Look out kids she’s going for the brass ring. Don’t miss it.”
