Even artists producing temporary works of art (Cristo & Jeanne-Claude; Andy Goldsworthy) document their work and produce books that allow the work to live on in some form. It's an important part of the process that is often neglected.

The meeting was called to order at 6:45pm on May 18, 2015

Financial: (Carol Adamec) Bank balance is \$1,814.53. There are presently 34 members all of whom have paid their annual membership fees.

Breeze suggested that we ask the UU Congregation to have a Mercado prior to our art show next year in April 2016. I will bring this request up at the next Art Committee meeting of UU.

Creativity in a Nutshell

One of my favorite writers on creativity, Arthur Koestler, has a unique way of describing three kinds of creativity:

* ARTISTIC: Ahhhhhhhh! * SCIENTIFIC: Ah-Ha!

* COMIC: Ha-Ha!

And that's it in a nutshell. Creativity is a response to something, not a sleight-of-hand that pulls something out of the air. It may be nothing more than an unusual juxtaposition of two very dissimilar things, leading from a treatment for one disease to a cure for another very different condition. It may be an artist combining totally unrelated elements in a painting to challenge the thinking of viewers. Certainly we can see how humor depends on the unexpected for its punch line.

So the way to become more creative is to investigate the possibilities of cross-fertilization—combining things that have nothing in common—to come up with a whole new concept. What a great idea! It just takes a little courage to put it down on paper or canvas. (©1999 Nita Leland)
