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April Meeting Notes

At our April 15 meeting about the future of Rainbow, a series of decisions were made. The full Meeting Notes were emailed to members. Here is a recap of the decisions which affect the future of Rainbow.

- We decided to adapt to changing times by updating the newsletter, perhaps trying Mail Chimp or a similar electronic news format.
- To use Ad Hoc Committees instead of standing committees so members can participate in a committee on a one time rotating basis.
- To have at least two out of three meetings at members' homes, meeting at OFFCenter approximately once every three months.
- To have more art making gatherings and social gatherings.
- To evaluate the effect of these changes in November.

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Feedback about Rainbow Artists

What Rainbow means to me.

In March we gathered to look at and talk about art. Looking at the video of abstract expressionist artist Joan Mitchell and the discussion afterwards was a great way to spend a Monday evening with Rainbow Artists at Off Center on March 18th. We were fortunate to have a lovely book of her art to peruse before the video.

In some ways the hour-long video seemed almost as abstract as JoanMitchell's work. There was little historical framework, but there was a lot of her art and her ambience. Joni first wanted to get inside her deaf mother's head and then she wanted to express what she herself felt. We see her in Chicago, New York and Paris and it would seem she found herself in France. She stresses the importance of love in her work particularly the love she feels when she paints.

I would like to continue to have meetings where we learn about the work of female artists, including that of our own members. Another activity would be to attend as a group the openings of shows our members are in (or another time perhaps a Saturday afternoon.) Perhaps we could organize a quarterly afternoon gallery visit and then get together in a place nearby to talk about the art or whatever.

Rainbow Artists has a proud history. Don't give the name up. We won a Bravos Award for our dedication to bringing women of all cultures together in art related expressions. We have a lovely vase given to us as a reward. We have a plaque from the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Multicultural Council honoring "Rainbow Artists with the 2003 Keep The Dream Alive Award". In 2011 we received a Certificate of Participation from the African American Museum and Cultural Center of New Mexico. Rainbow Artists is a name and a past to be proud of.
