Monthly Program: Monthly Program: Art in the Three Pines Mysteries of Louise Penny Presented by Caroline LeBlanc Monday, May 16, 2016, 6:30 pm OFFCenter Community Arts 808 Park Avenue SW

Canadian writer, Louise Penny, integrates the visual arts and poetry into her mysteries which are set in the fictious Quebec village of Three Pines. Two of her central characters are artists married to each other, each with very different styles. Of the two, the woman is the more talented, though for a long time, less successful artist. She also features an actual Quebecois artist—deceased—who is of some renown, though overlooked outside of French Canada. And Emily Carr's work even makes a cameo. This will be a chance to look at how a fiction writer incorporates the arts and artists into her work, and tweaks her readers into inquiring about the arts in ways they otherwise might not have done.

Caroline LeBlanc is a published poet and non-fiction writer, an Apronista, and a (relatively inactive) member of Rainbow Artists. She has just finished

teaching a workshop at UNM's OSHER Institute on Louise Penny's Inspector Gamache/Three Pines mystery series, and she thought it would be fun to talk with a group of artists about all the artists and art issues that Penny incorporates in her books.
