#### **Create at Chaco**

If spending next October in Chaco Culture National Historic Park working on your art sounds like a dream come true, be sure to apply by Nov. 15 for next year's residency. The opportunity is open to artists working in any medium and includes living quarters suitable for a single artist or a couple, as well as a \$1,000 stipend. The artist in residence will be granted a venue for at least one Public Presentation of a workshop, lecture or concert. Hyperallergic profiles some of the artists who have taken advantage of this program in the past, such as Dawnja Burris, who says of Chaco: "I refuse to call them ruins," she said. "The place is very much alive." The article also discusses the legacy of arts in the national parks, and the role artists might play in helping to preserve these natural environments in the face of threats, such as oil and gas drilling.

### Kodak Mobile Film Scanner

The **Kodak Mobile Film Scanner** was created to allow quick digitization of your 35mm film and mounted slides. In concert with a cellphone loaded with the Kodak Mobile Film Scanner app, this device allows quick scanning, including live negative to positive inversion for easy frame selections.

Using just 2 AA batteries (not included) and a heavy-weight cardboard frame, a small light table back-lights your film, just like a classic light table - but on a much smaller scale. The Mobile Film Scanner acts as a copy stand, using your phone camera to do the actual scanning. This means that your phone's resolution determines the ultimate size of the image. Most top-tier modern cellphone cameras (2018-present) will be able to produce a 5 x 7 inch at 300dpi jpeg, for printing at home, through an app or a lab, or even through an instant film printer.

This is not an endorsement, but at only \$39.99 from www.freestylephoto.biz, it's worth consideration.
