Treasury balance is \$1,937.32 which includes fees from St. Michael's Gallery exhibition.

Janine reminded everyone to send an image and details for any exhibitions or awards you have to her or Joan Fenicle so your creative endeavors can be posted on Facebook and in the newsletter.

Linsay Locke, Janine Wilson and Suzanne Vizor each have paintings in the Fine Arts Building of the State Fair. Suzanne said there were very few fiber pieces entered. Eliza Schmid has exhibitions in September at Matrix and 606 Gallery. Linsay Locke is in Transformations at Tortuga in September.

Winnings Coffee exhibit will be in January of 2019 with the theme of Creative Women. There is only room for one painting per artists. The show at the Unitarian Church will be from February 16 – March 30. Details for entering both shows will be forthcoming closer to the drop off dates.

Janine is following up on a possible show at Java Joes. Caroline LeBlanc is following up with Keshet. Information so far is that they will handle sales, want us to attend their shows and have a table at the show.


Tortuga has offered us a show in October of 2019. The theme is art inspired by female Nobel Peace Prize winners. Janine will send out a list next month so we can sign up for different women. There are 16 in all and we want to be sure to do a piece for each.

Los Lunas Museum of Heritage and Art is setting the schedule for next year. We talked about possible themes for submitting a proposal. A few ideas were Bosque, Rio, Flora and Fauna, Grasses Flowers of New Mexico, Railroads. Think about it and we will decide in September. New member Melissa Siddall presented an opportunity to show at the Visitor's Center in Bernalillo. They have no hanging system so we might have to hang on easels or panels. The show will be in April-May. They will not handle sales so people would need to contact us directly. Melissa will let them know we are interested and follow up with hanging suggestions.

Janine Wilson presented the opportunity for participating in the Albuquerque Showcase in August of 2019. Tortuga Gallery has offered to rent a booth, staff it and handle the sales with a 40% commission. This is outside of Rainbow and the artists need to pay the booth fee. Nova Denise, Illona Halderman, Linsay Locke, Eliza Schmid and Janine Wilson will participate. Eliza Schmid will pay the booth deposit and the balance will be due in December.

Ginger reminded us that September's meeting will be finishing the spirit dolls for our exhibition at Off Center in December.


